CAST 'Members Only' meeting with guest speaker: Professor Allyson Pollock

Online Saturday 31st October 10:45-12:15

We are delighted to welcome Professor Allyson Pollock to speak at our first 'members only' meeting!

As Director of the Newcastle University Centre for Excellence in Regulatory Science, Prof. Pollock has spoken out about the corporate direction in which NHS Trust Boards are being driven, with mergers going hand-in-hand with reducing services and the establishment of private companies. Highlighting that we must be very aware that the government is trying to find alternative ways of funding, in addition to expensive PFI councils are under pressure to raise bonds to finance hospitals and services at the same time as facing massive cuts in their own budgets - this money should be used for council services not tied into new forms of 'Project Finance' for hospitals and NHS services.

We will also be presenting our members with the first draft of the CAST 'People's Manifesto' based entirely on feedback from our recent series of public consultations and online survey.

South Tynesiders have clearly demonstrated that we can and must do better to make the borough more inclusive and democratic - NOW is the time!

New group to campaign for special needs children

Parents and carers of children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) in South Tyneside have formed a new group called Arise South Tyneside to campaign on behalf of families in the area.

This follows a breakdown in relations between South Tyneside Council (STC) and the parent carer forum known as South Tyneside Stronger Together, who have been critical of the Town Hall's response to SEND children's needs, following results of a recent survey sent to their members and shared on Facebook.

In a statement, South Tyneside Stronger Together said they had had one of their most successful years to date but that the local council had 'systematically wanted to take out independent views that challenge their objectives' and only wanted to 'hear success stories of their work'. WHAT IS...the Sheffield model?

Each month, our new section 'What is...?' will take an unbiased look at terms often used but never really explained - this month 'the Sheffield model' and could it work for South Tyneside?

'The Council is run for and on behalf of the people of South Tyneside and the Council's assets belong, collectively, to the people of the Borough'...'Our aim is to work for our community in an open and transparent way and keep local people informed and involved in all we do.'⁽¹⁾

South Tyneside Council (STC) operates a 'Leader and Cabinet model'.⁽²⁾ Basically, this means that the **majority party**, in our case Labour, chooses a leader, currently Iain Malcolm, who then chooses nine other **majority party** councillors to make up a 'cabinet' and be responsible for areas, known as portfolios, including Transport, Housing and Environment. The cabinet has the power to make key decisions, but the leader can override them. This small group made up **entirely** from the **majority party** holds the power to make almost all decisions – essentially, all other elected councillors are virtually excluded from the decision-making process. With more and more power being concentrated into the hands of this small group, many South Tynesiders are now asking 'What's the point of voting if our councillors are excluded?' So, is there a solution?

In Sheffield, 2018, **It's Our City** launched a petition calling for a move from their Strong Leader Model to the 'Modern Committee System' (MCS). Each council designs its own MCS according to own its needs but the example raised in Sheffield was that the city could have eight or nine councillors in a small committee for each portfolio. External experts and representatives from voluntary and community organisations could also be invited to bring in alternative views and suggestions. Both Brighton and Reading Councils are currently using a MCS while Chester East is adopting one following lengthy discussions to design a suitable model.⁽³⁾

Democracy is 'government by the people or their elected representatives'.⁽⁴⁾ If the power of decision-making is concentrated in the hands of a very small group and the majority of our **elected** councillors are shut out, where is the democracy in South Tyneside?

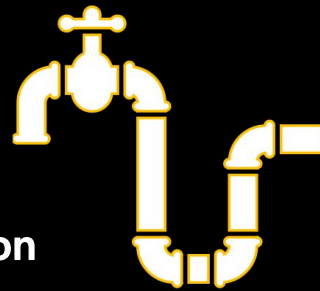


The 'Friends of South Tyneside Hospital' is a charity working with Richmond Taxis offering
